 - ❑ Taking drugs



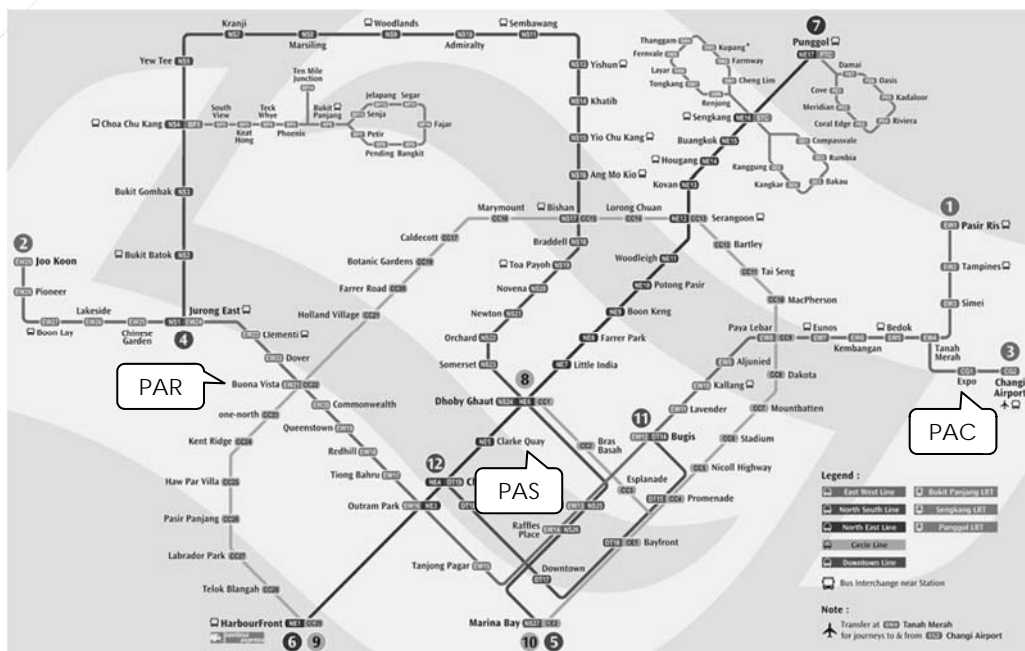
TRANSPORTATION

- Singapore transportation system make up of Mass Rapid Transit (MRT), Light Rail Train (LRT), Bus and Taxi.
- The public bus is the most cost effective way to travel in Singapore.
- While MRT is the most efficient way to reach your working destination.
- You may only need to have a "Ez-link" card with you to pay for public transport fare e.g. MRT, LRT or Public Bus (operate by SBS and SMRT)

- To start with renting a house in Singapore, you should know where your working location is.
- You may seek for real estate agency in Singapore to look out for a room or whole unit. [Room rate for common room range from S\$600-700/room, maximum 2 pax/room]
- You will require to pay for room deposit (1-2 months) to your landlord upon signing of contract.
- Over 80% of Singapore residents live in public housing called as HDB flat, rented a room in HDB flat is the cheapest option for housing in Singapore.
- It is advisable to rent a house nearby MRT station and keep close to your working location, to save you time of travel.

- Singapore have variety of eating places that you can find most of famous local dishes at your affordable price.
- Coffee shops can be found in most housing estates that located at ground floor of HDB flat.
- Fast food chain such as Mcdonald, KFC, Pizza hut, Mos Burger, Burger king etc.
- Hawker Centres and Food Courts such as Kopitiam, Food Junction, Food Republic, Banquet etc



INCOME TAX/ TAX CLEARANCE

- ▶ Foreign employees are liable to income tax in Singapore, on all income accrued in or derived from Singapore.
- ▶ Employment income will be taxed at a flat rate of 15% or higher if your employment is less than 6 months.
- ▶ If your annual income is S\$20,000 or more, you are subject to personal income tax.
- ▶ Tax clearance apply to all work pass holders.
- ▶ It is a process of ensuring all foreign employees pays all his taxes when he ceases employment from his employer.
- ▶ Work pass holder must remain in Singapore till all tax clearance is done.
